Dear Parents /Carers

Year 11 Uniform June 2017

As in previous years, Year 10 students will change uniform after half-term as part of their rite of passage into Year 11.

Year 10 students have been involved in the discussions about uniform and it has been agreed that the Year 11 uniform of blue jumpers, shirts and ties (for boys) is to be worn by all from Monday 5th June. Boys will wear shirts and ties, whilst girls will wear white blouses. The blue jumpers and the ties, along with any sports kit will be available from The School Uniform Shop.

May I remind you that the rules on school uniform continue to apply:

- Plain black tailored trousers without adornment (e.g. studs/external zip etc.). A plain black narrow belt may be worn if necessary. When trousers are laid flat, the hems should measure *at least* 20 cm from seam to seam (i.e. 40 cm all the way round) and not more than 25cm.
 - Cords or jeans / jeans style are not acceptable;
 - Lycra trousers are not acceptable (e.g. “Miss Sexy”);
 - Skinny leg / leggings / jeggings / cigarette pants / Capri pants / tapered ankle styles etc. are not acceptable.
- Plain black tailored skirt on or near the knee;
 - Lycra skirts are not acceptable;
 - Pleated skirts are not acceptable;
 - Skater / tight pencil / short skirts are not acceptable.
- Navy blue Fairfield jumper
- White shirt/blouse
- Black or flesh-coloured tights or socks.
- Black flat shoes suitable for walking around a rural site (**not** backless - heel height maximum 5cm).
 - Trainers are not acceptable except for PE.

Students should have a warm and waterproof coat without bright colours, pictures or logos (hoodies are not acceptable and should not be worn to school).

Jewellery is expected to be minimal – one small plain stud earring per ear lobe is acceptable.

Bracelets, rings and necklaces are not allowed, for reasons of Health and Safety.

Hairstyle and colour should be appropriate for school; make up should be kept to a minimum. Hair must be tied back for practical subjects.
